Gentlemen:

In compliance with Commission orders pertaining to gas proration in the defined gas pools, Lea County, New Mexico, we are submitting gas well plats and Forms C-104, Request for (Cil)-(Cas) Allowable, and C-110, Certificate of Compliance and Authorization to Transport Cil and Natrual Gas, for Gulf Oil Corporation's Arnott-Ramsay "E" Lease, Well No. 5, located in Section 16, T-25-8, R-37-E, Lea County, New Mexico. This gas well is producing from the Yates-Seven Rivers Formation and is in the Jalmat Gas Pool.

Due to the location of this well with respect to the proposed 280-acre unit boundaries, it will be necessary for us to apply for a hearing for a non-standard 280-acre gas proration unit. In order to prevent drainage and protect correlative rights, we desire to have our well connected to a gas transmission facility and an allowable assigned as soon as possible. We would like to know if it is permissable under the existing pool rules for this well to be assigned a 160-acre allowable, when the requirements of Rule 12, Order R-520 are met, pending the hearing and ruling by the Commission for the 280-acre unit.
