Gentlemen:

Mr. Cecil Tilley, Texas Pacific Oil Company, Inc., has requested that I write to you to explain why Texas Pacific has not cleaned up the tank battery location on the Gutman 18 lease, being the W/2 SW/4 Section 18, Township 25-S, Range 37-E, Lea County.

On September 1, 1970, the South Langlie Jal Unit (which we operate) became effective. Among the leases going into the unit was the Texas Pacific Gutman 18 lease containing three wells. However, only two of Texas Pacific's wells on this lease were taken into the unit. Texas Pacific retained the Gutman 18 No. 1 well. It is my understanding that Texas Pacific has plugged and abandoned the Gutman 18 No. 1 well. The tank battery located on the Gutman 18 lease became unit property; therefore, the tank battery is no longer the responsibility of Texas Pacific.

The two remaining wells on what was formerly Texas Pacific Gutman 18 lease are operated by Reserve Oil and Gas Company as part of the South Langlie Jal Unit. These wells are South Langlie Jal Unit Nos. 20 and 24. New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission Page 2 June 30, 1972

It will be Reserve Oil and Gas Company's responsibility to clean up the tank battery site when the unit is no longer in operation.
