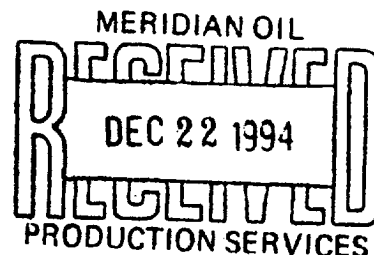

Administrative Order NSL-3445 (SD)

Dear Ms. Williams:

Reference is made to your application dated November 16, 1994, for a non-standard Jalmat gas well location in an existing non-standard 120-acre gas spacing and proration unit (GPU) for said Jalmat Gas Pool comprising the NW/4 SW/4 and S/2 NW/4 of Section 33, Township 25 South, Range 37 East, NMPM, Lea County, New Mexico. Said GPU was authorized by Division Administrative Order NSP-1661(SD), dated February 1, 1993 and currently has dedicated thereon the El Paso Tom Federal Well No. 7 (API No. 30-025-11881), located at a standard gas well location 1980 feet from the South line and 660 feet from the West line (Unit L) of said Section 33.

It is our understanding that the subject well to be considered in this application is currently a producing oil well in the Langlie-Mattix Pool and upon issuance of this order will be recompleted up-hole into the Jalmat Gas Pool.

By authority granted me under the provisions of Rule 2(c) of the Special Rules and Regulations for the Jalmat Gas Pool, as promulgated by Division Order No. R-8170, as amended, the following described well located at an unorthodox Jalmat gas well location is hereby approved:

*R. O. Gregory Well No. 3
330' FSL - 660' FWL (Unit M) of said Section 33
API No. 30-025-11874*

Also, you are hereby authorized to simultaneously dedicate Jalmat gas production from the El Paso Tom Federal Well No. 7 with the R. O. Gregory Well No. 3. Furthermore, you are hereby permitted to produce the allowable assigned the subject GPU from both wells in any proportion.

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
