## DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

T.D. 3495' 8" Lime. Pulled rods and tubing. Mixed 7 tons native clay and reran tubing open ended to 3485' & circulated hole. Mixed 60 sacks Starcor cement & spotted on bottom upward to approximately 3240'. Pulled 15" tension in 7" casing and started shooting 7" at 2800', shooting at 100' intervals upward until casing was free after last shot at 2400'. Recovered 2415' of 7" casing. Filled hole with heavy mud from 3240' to 1300' and spotted 22 sacks cement from 1300' to 1250'. Shot 9-5/8" casing at 500', 400' and 300'. Pulled 306' of 9-5/8" casing. Mudded hole to surface and put in 8 sacks cement. Put in 4" pipe marker. Location abandoned.
