soil inclusions.

Floristics

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The local floral assemblage is dominated by the Gramineae as well as allow understory of <u>Quercus havardii</u>, <u>Yucca glauca</u>, and <u>Prosopis juliflora</u>. Important grasses include <u>Stipa</u> <u>neomexicana</u>, <u>Aristida sp.</u>, <u>Bouteloua eriopoda</u>; and <u>Bouteloua</u> sp. Annual and peremial forbs are limited to <u>Euphorbia</u> <u>missourica</u>, <u>Senecio spartiodes</u>, and <u>Croton</u> sp.

Cultural Resources

No cultural resources were recorded during this reconnaissance. This portion of the Eunice Plain is generally marked by a dearth of material cultural remains although occasional artifacts do occur on a strictly random basis. This phenomenon can attributed to the fact that lithic inclusions are absent in local soil individuals, the lack of caliche for hearth construction, and a scanty supply of water since Pleistocene times. Economic activities, since that epoch, have focused on huntingand hunting-related activities.

Recommendations

NMAS recommends clearance for Jack B "17" Well No.5 and its short access road and suggests that work-related activities proceed according to Continental Oil Company's existing plans.
