Gentlemen:

We are in the process of filing Form USGS-3160-3 and NMOCD Form C-102 with the Bureau of Land Management Carlsbad District office for permission to drill our newly proposed Jack A-20 No. 11 well as an infill Jalmat (Gas) well at a standard Jalmat (Gas) location consisting of 2180' FSL and 1980' FEL (J), Section 20, T-24-S, R-37-E, Lea County, New Mexico.

We hereby request administrative approval to combine the two existing 160-acre non-standard Jalmat (Gas) proration units consisting of the NE/4 Section 20 (NSP-964) and SE/4 Section 20 (NSP-965) into a single 320-acre Jalmat (Gas) proration unit comprising the entire E/2 of Section 20, T-24-S, R-37-E, Lea County, New Mexico. The previously referenced 160-acre Jalmat (Gas) proration units are presently dedicated to our Jack A-20 No. 9 well (A-20-24S-37E) and Jack A-20 No. 10 well (O-20-24S-37E) both of which were recently acquired by Hartman from Conoco, Inc, et al.

Following the reformation of the two existing 160-acre Jalmat proration units, we request administrative approval to simultaneously dedicate along with the Jack A-20 No. 9 and NO. 10 our newly proposed Jack A-20 No. 11 (J-20-24S-37E) well to the combined 320-acre non-standard Jalmat (Gas) proration unit consisting of E/2 Section 20, T-24-S, R-37-E, Lea County, New Mexico (Standard P.U. = 640 acres).

Furthermore, if the proposed well is completed as a commercial producer and in compliance with the Natural Gas Policy Act of 1978, an application will be submitted to the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division to obtain administrative approval for the Jack A-20 No. 11 as a Section 103 infill well.
