DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

This well was plugged back from 3525' TD to 3335' PBTD with 70 sacks of cement, starting pressure 400#, final pressure 1000#. Fifteen feet of cement was left above retainer. The 5 1/2" casing was perforated, 2 shots per foot, (3100'-3050')(3030'-3005')(2970'-2940')(2930'-2920')(2900'-2890')(2885'-2870')(2850'-2830')(2820'-2800') 180' with 360 holes. Tubing was run and head set. The well was scrubbed and flowed to clean-up. It was flowed 5 days to clean-up. On the fifth day, it produced 1312 MCF gas with a FTP 700#, FCP 750# with 6.44 barrels oil per million cu.ft. gas. Prior to plug back, this well was depleted in the Langlie-Mattix Oil Pool and was plugged back and recompleted within the vertical limits of the Jalmat Gas Pool.
