Total Depth, 3633', Line. 5-1/2" casing cemented at 3488'.

We desire permission to shoot this well with approximately 205 quarts of liquid nitro-glycerine from 3528' to 3633', tamping the shot with approximately 1/2 yard of gravel. The well produced 27 barrels of pipe line oil in 10 hours, swabbing and bailing. Results of the shot will be reported after shooting and cleaning out to bottom.
